Some daytime delivery and assessment may be required by negotiation and prior warning.</p> <p>Be available to attend lectures and sessions and complete work throughout the TEC Partnership Term Dates specified on the TEC Partnership website;</p> <p>To attend lectures and sessions on the specified days and maintain attendance above TEC Partnership expectations of 90%;</p> <p>Complete up to 39 hours a week work towards your qualification made up of a range of contact delivery, set work and work towards assessments;</p> <p>Have student finance or other means to pay for the course in place before enrolment;</p> <p>Take all reasonable steps to comply with the policies and procedures of TEC partnership.</p>

Demonstrate knowledge of contemporary issues affecting the personal and social education of children and young people including health, education and youth justice. 2. Understand and critically evaluate relevant research and be able to collect, analyse and interpret qualitative and/or quantitative data. 3. Utilise knowledge of the theoretical principles underpinning the practice of support work with children and young people provided by the National Occupational Standards for Youth Work and National Occupational Standards for Social Work. 4. Demonstrate the ability to foster democratic and inclusive practice through building trusting relations, encouraging participation, and increasing voice and influence. 5. Demonstrate skills in building partnerships with other professionals, across different sectors, creating effective alliances and networks that contribute to supporting and safeguarding children and young people 6. Think critically and use personal reflection skills in relation to values and ethics in social care and youth support practice. 7. Apply and critically evaluate current social policy and legislative frameworks which direct core practice and demonstrate the ability to respond to change.
